

UPEACE ONLINE PROGRAMME STRUCTURE 2017-18

UPEACE Online Programme offers the following options within the programme in 2017-18:

A. Online MA in Sustainable Peace in the Contemporary World

Tuition fee: USD 15,000

Students can obtain the Online MA in Sustainable Peace in the Contemporary World upon successful completion of 42 credits, including 36 credits for course work and 6 credits for a final independent research project (IRP).

Courses offered as part of the Online MA programme are divided into 6 thematic areas. In order to graduate from the programme, students must undertake the courses marked as ‘Mandatory’ (14 credits) in the list below. In addition, students must take optional courses (22 credits) from the list, before completing their final graduation project (IRP).

Following are the six thematic areas and the courses offered within those themes by the Online MA programme.

Note: Courses underlined are cross-listed between two themes.

B. Online Diploma in Peace Studies

Tuition Fee: USD 5,000

Students can also obtain an Online Diploma in Peace Studies upon successfully completing courses worth 12 credits offered within the Online MA programme, and additionally, writing a final academic exam. Students opting for the Online Diploma can choose any of the courses offered by the Programme.

C. Online Certificate Programmes

Tuition fee:

For credit: USD 3,800

For non-credit: USD 2,750

Students completing all the courses within one of the thematic areas listed above will be entitled to a certificate. The Certificates corresponding to each thematic area are:

2. Certificate in World Politics and Conflicts Analysis
3. Certificate in Contemporary Global Agenda
4. Certificate in Implementing the Peace Agenda: Social Dimensions
5. Certificate in Implementing the Peace Agenda: Security Dimensions
6. Certificate in Tools for Implementing the Peace Agenda

D. Individual Online Courses:

Tuition Fee:

For 9 week courses with 3 Credits: USD 950

For 9 week courses without Credits: USD 750

For 6 week courses with 2 Credits: USD 700

For 6 week courses without Credits: USD 500

Students can also enroll in any of the individual courses offered by the Online Programme. Students enrolling in and successfully completing individual courses for credits will obtain a certificate of completion and upon request, an academic transcript. Students enrolling in and successfully completing individual courses without credits will obtain a certificate of completion.
